YOU DID IT FOR ME: It’s another year for the world. But for many in Zimbabwe, it could be another year of failed harvests and withered crops. The devastating and drying effects of El Nino are expected to hit crops for a third year in Southern Africa. Some 2.4 million people are going hungry. CRS is partnering with Caritas Harare to tackle the drought emergency and is organizing seed fairs to provide farmers with drought-resistant seeds and new farming techniques.

FAITH MOMENT REFLECTION: We all encounter difficulties in life at one point or another. They may arise from situations at home, work, or school. Or in our faith community. Those situations are never easy. Although no one can lessen the difficulty that often surrounds these circumstances, the words of St. Paul in today’s second reading may help us take a broader view. St. Paul tells us that as Christians, we are to be united in the same mind and same purpose – our allegiance is to Jesus Christ first. As Christians, we all belong to Jesus Christ, which means we belong to one another in living out our faith as He taught us. St. Paul knew that our human nature and limitations can cause disagreements and divisions among us. But when we agree that Jesus is the foundation of our Christian faith, we can begin to heal those divisions and build a stronger Church for the future.


