- 3 – He talked about the Great Spirit*

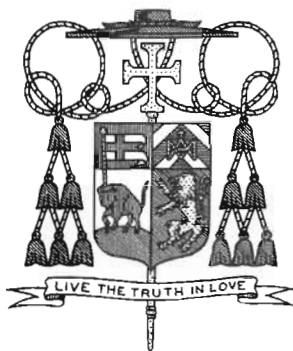
But then there were 3 equally good arguments that Jesus was Irish:

For people living in these regions, barriers to practicing the faith include lack of resources, shortages of pastoral agents, and poor infrastructures that make relatively simple things like participating in weekly Mass difficult. For example, in northern Peru, great distances and deteriorated roads mean that church agents must often travel by foot or mule to rural communities. As a result, some communities are visited by pastoral agents and ministers only once per month, others sometimes just twice per year. Because of your support, leaders continue to reach out and serve the rural communities, ensuring that all feel included in our family of faith.

Our diocese contributes to support this important work by a second collection during the month of May. Please be generous in this collection and take this opportunity to share your faith with families in Latin America and the Caribbean. Your support in May 2017 will make a difference.
