YOU DID IT FOR ME: *Jenny was removed from her parents' home where she suffered abuse and neglect. She bounced from foster home to foster home until a family member agreed to take custody, which lasted until Jenny was 15 when she became homeless. She stayed on the couches of friends and, incredibly, was able to graduate high school. She needed help with her next steps, so she turned to her local Catholic Charities mentoring program. Now Jenny has temporary housing and is attending college. Across the country in 2015, Catholic Charities agencies provided 450,770 clients with some kind of housing-related service.
