This great Marian Shrine exists today because of the generosity of American Catholics and clergy, the prayers of the faithful, and the hard work of the artisans and laborers who began building it nearly 100 years ago. The Conference of Bishops has authorized a one-time collection to be taken in all the parishes of the United States. This collection will help offset the cost of completing the mosaic of the Trinity Dome at the Basilica. Please give as generously as you can.

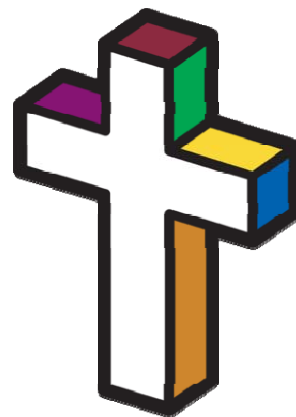
