FAITH MOMENT REFLECTION: We must have confidence in God, even when storms may be raging in our lives. Our scripture readings today share that message – do not be afraid, God is with us. He will guide us through. But so often we don't recognize God right in front of us. In the gospel, Jesus invites Peter to walk across the raging sea toward him, encouraging him to have confidence and trust. Christ never takes his eyes off Peter, but when the disciple starts to doubt, he sinks into the water. Jesus catches Peter and gets him safely back into the boat, and the storm is calmed. God invites us to turn to him in trust, in times of doubt and fear, discouragement, and distress. We may be distracted by the rage of the storm, but God never takes his eyes off of us. Whatever your challenges, turn to God and keep moving forward in confidence.
