FAITH MOMENT REFLECTION: In today's gospel, Jesus surprises the Pharisees who try to entrap him with a trick question about paying taxes to Caesar. Jesus replies, "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." Like the Pharisees, we might be a bit surprised by the answer Jesus gives them. Are we to be loyal to two kingdoms equally? On the contrary. Jesus teaches us we are to be both *in* the world yet not *of* the world. That means, God comes first - to him we give undivided service and worship. If our loyalty to God comes first, then there is no problem "giving to Caesar what belongs to Caesar." The way of God is not in opposing authority but in living like Jesus with integrity, truthfulness, and honesty, responding appropriately in each "kingdom". After all, remember, everything in this world ultimately belongs to God.
