PARISH FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Dear Fellow Parishioners:

The Diocesan Church Calendar Year has closed and the Finance Committee of the Parish recently met to approve the year-end report.

Father Innocent chose two capital projects (parking lot at East Bethany site and air conditioning for the Pavilion site) in the parish utilizing our share of the money we will receive from Upon This Rock as mandated by the Diocese. To date, we have received \$13,299.03 from the pledges honored by our parishioners. In order for the projects to be completed before receiving all the pledge money, the Finance Committee voted to use funds from the St. Joseph Investment Fund Account (savings account). As the pledges are honored and the diocese forwards our share (35%), it will be deposited into the St. Joseph Investment Fund. In order to balance the budget and the recent unexpected repairs to the septic system at the East Bethany site, additional funds will need to be withdrawn. The total amount withdrawn will be \$50,000.

We hope that our parishioners who have been very supportive of the church will continue to honor their pledges and continue with their weekly collections. As unexpected projects arise at our parish sites, we will share these with our church community.

Thank you for your continued support and God bless you and your family.
