Jesus rebukes them as hypocrites saying, "you disregard God's commandments, but you cling to human traditions." Jesus stresses that the customs and rituals we practice are not what really makes us good and just. Rather, it's what's in our hearts – our reasons for doing what we do – that define whether our actions are in keeping with God's plan for us. Sure, we can talk the talk. But are we walking the walk? Take some time to revisit your motives and let what is within your heart guide you in how you express your faith.
