CHRIST THE KING SEMINARY; GATHERING

AROUND CHRIST: In today's Liturgy of the Word, the Gospel of Mark speaks of the healing and transformative touch of Christ within our lives as well as the call for our lives, minds, and hearts to continue to "be opened" to the Lord. For us to "be opened" in Christ, the letter of St. James calls us to show no partiality and discern how God chooses the poor in the world to be rich in faith. The words of the prophet Isaiah boldly proclaim – especially to those whose lives are burdened by fear – to "be strong" and to welcome the saving love of God that we experience in our weakness. At Christ the King Seminary, spiritual formation is an essential aspect of the Christian formation for seminarians, deacon candidates, and lay people as they prepare for dedicated service to Christ and the people of God through ordained ministry or lay ecclesial ministry.

FAITH MOMENT: In the Gospel today we see an incredible demonstration of faith. Some followers of Jesus brought a deaf man with a speech impediment to Him and begged Him to heal the man. Their faith in Jesus and their faithfulness in caring for their friend resulted in the man being able to hear and speak as Jesus laid His hands on him and cured him. Our faith in God and our dedication to His teachings calls us to make the effort and plead the case of those in need – the poor, the sick, the lonely. Ask God how you can better serve Him and those in need around you today. In the words of Saint Teresa of Calcutta, "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love."
