FAITH MOMENT: Today’s readings show us that those called to do God’s will don’t always feel up to the challenge. Isaiah, Paul and Peter all express some sense of inadequacy, accepting that they don’t measure up to what God wants. But here is the key lesson. They all take the risk and willingly embrace God’s call, giving whatever they have. Because they know God is with them as they turn in a new direction to follow Him. We may not be called to make such radical changes as quitting a job or moving to another country for God. But He does constantly call us to change, to continuously improve – to follow the example of Jesus and give of ourselves for the benefit of others. Don’t be concerned that you may not measure up to what God wants. Break out of your comfort zone and answer His call. Rest assured that when God calls, He will be with you.
