Household Helpers

- To clean copper-bottom pots, use ketchup.
- Wrap cheese in parchment or wax paper; then place in an open plastic bag; store in the refrigerator.

How to Have a Great Lawn

Crabgrass is a big problem here in America. To prevent the pesky problem provide your lawn with a healthy dose of good thick rye grass to compete with the crabgrass. Also aeration can help.
