MARRIAGE MOMENT: A grain of wheat must fall to the ground and die to produce much fruit. (Jn. 12:24) What needs to die in you to bear fruit in your marriage? Pride? The desire to always be right? Wanting stuff your way? Avoiding decisions? Humble yourself today.

PARENTING PERSPECTIVE: "Gimme, get me, I want it, I saw it on TV!" We used to make fun of this jingo with our kids. Although TV is a frequent companion in many homes, we needn't be a slave to it. Sometimes humor can help. Can you and your child identify one item advertised on TV or the internet that you really don't need? Laugh together about how ridiculous it is that advertisers present it as a life necessity.

FAMILY PERSPECTIVE: Relationships come with a price tag. We must be willing to entrust ourselves to another, to let go of our autonomy and die to our independence. It is in dying to our independence that we find interdependence with others.

YOU DID IT FOR ME: When banana trees die, Hamuli Kahati has nothing to sell. And his family has nothing to eat. That's why Catholic Relief Services started a school where farmers could learn new ways to care for their trees together.

By working together, Hamuli's community supports one another--and guarantees that not only do the banana trees survive, but every family does, too.

FAITH MOMENT REFLECTION: Scientists estimate the average person makes five choices per minute, adding up to as many as 5,000 choices or decisions every day. Most we don't even think about. But of all the choices we make, the most important – the one we should consciously make every day – is to choose to love God and one another. Today's reading from the Book of Jeremiah teaches about the choice God makes to enter into a covenantal relationship with his people. It is a covenant that is not written on paper, but rather in our hearts. It is a relationship in which he promises, "I will be their God, and they shall be my people". In other words, the only stipulation of this covenant is love. We enter into and remain in that covenantal relationship with God when we decide to love God and our neighbor. It is God's love, residing in our hearts, which will help us to do just that – to remain faithful to a life of integrity and love for our fellow man. All we have to do is decide to love. The choice is yours. A personal and loving relationship with God is yours for the taking.
