DID YOU KNOW? The first priest recorded to say Mass in Pavilion was Rev. J. McGlew, who in August 1858 celebrated Mass in the home of Patrick Mulvey. The congregation was organized in July 1858, and Pavilion was made a mission of St. Joseph’s, Batavia. In 1861, Father Cunningham bought an old blacksmith’s shop in Pavilion and remodeled it into a church. Some of the families at this time were; Foley, Armour, Murphy, Mulvey, Powers, Kenna and Quinlan (Some are ancestors of families who are current parishioners).

FAITH MOMENT REFLECTION: We hear a lot about tolerance these days. But it's important to make a distinction between just putting up with someone and the true tolerance that we learn about in today's reading. The Apostle Peter tells us that God shows no partiality – whoever acts uprightly is acceptable to Him. Thus, true tolerance requires the Golden Rule that Jesus himself espoused: treat others as you would like them to treat you. Father Dominique Pire, a 1958 Nobel Peace Prize recipient from Belgium, went so far as suggesting we need a better word than tolerance. He said, “Let us not speak of tolerance. This negative word implies grudging concessions by smug consciences. Rather, let us speak of mutual understanding and mutual respect.” That is the true tolerance God wants us to practice.
