DID YOU KNOW? In 1861 a lot in Pavilion was bought from John Doty who did not know that it was being purchased for Catholic property. Father Cunningham was instrumental in building a church 60 x 40 feet. This structure remains as the main part of our present church. Our parish, a mission, was then attached to Warsaw, NY.

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR NEPAL RELIEF:

Bishop Malone has requested a special Diocesan collection to help Catholic Relief Services in sending materials for emergency shelter and for safe water, sanitation and hygiene as these are expected to be the most urgent needs for the victims of the earthquake in Nepal.
