WORLD YOUTH DAY: The next World Youth Day with Pope Francis will be in Krakow, Poland in July 2016. Bishop Malone is encouraging youth from ages 16-35 to attend, and he is also attending as well. Our diocese plans to take a group of approximately 170 people which includes chaperones. There is a group of 11 youth from the Wyoming Association of Catholic Youth (W.A.C.Y.) plus 2 chaperones who are planning to attend. For each one of them this is truly a unique opportunity to grow closer to Christ and to grow in our faith. We are calling ourselves the "Polish Pilgrims". This is a major commitment by each one of them, both spiritually and financially. Therefore, we are asking our parish community for support. The cost will be \$4,000 for each pilgrim. Each person and their families have committed to a portion of that expense. We hope that through work as well as donations and support from our parishes we will have adequate funds. How each parish can help:


