MISSION APPEAL WEEKEND: This weekend, our second collection will benefit "Building Minds in South Sudan". Mathon Noi, a "Lost Boy" from South Sudan will be here to speak to the congregation. Mathon fled his village joining thousands of other young boys who had to flee their villages when they were all attacked by the militia in the late 1980's. During his ordeal, Mathon was shot three times, survived on one meal a day for nine years in a Kenyan refugee camp and was finally resettled in Rochester in 2001. Because he was fortunate enough to receive an education in Kenya and ultimately graduate from Niagara University, he is now giving back to his village in the most profound way. He and his cousin, Sebastian Maroundit, co-founded Building Minds in South Sudan whose mission is to build schools in their village as the children attend "under tree" school in most of South Sudan. Their dream has become a beautiful reality, but there is more work to be done. Mathon's story is one of courage, determination, giving and deep caring. Please give as generously as you can.
