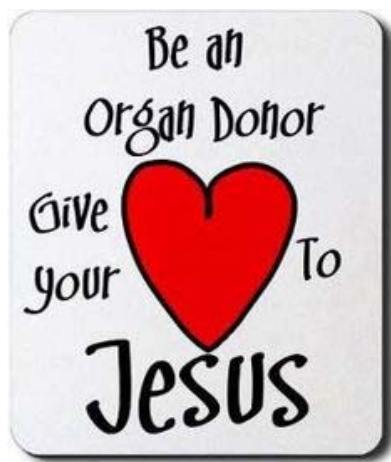

The Gospel reading then brings it all together as Jesus explains to an individual what we are to do to inherit eternal life – place doing the will of God above all our earthly treasures. Of course, we are asked to follow God's commandments, Jesus says. But it is not enough to avoid doing harm to others – we must also reach out to them. We are called to be Christ's presence in our world, putting God first and following the example of Jesus, as we care for those in need.

On this Sunday, we will gather at the Eucharist, as will Catholics throughout the world, in a spirit of love for Evangelization so that, through *our prayers and concrete acts of solidarity*, the gift of faith may be shared with all.
