WORLD MISSION SUNDAY: This weekend, October 17th and 18th, our parish will celebrate World Mission Sunday. This year we are invited to reach out and help the Pontifical Mission Societies in the US. Your ongoing support of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith is vital to the missionaries serving in 1,150 dioceses throughout Asia, Africa, parts of Latin America and Europe, and on the Islands of the Pacific. Your generosity makes it possible for local priests, religious, and catechists to reach out to communities, families and children in desperate need, bringing the light of Christ to the darkest of circumstances. The World Mission Sunday celebration highlights the outreach of local churches through priests, religious and laity among the poor and marginalized half a world away. Life-changing help is provided to mission churches in territories covering more than half the globe. Your prayers and generous support offered to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith on World Mission Sunday directly benefit the mission church – and help deepen your relationship with Jesus by helping so many missionaries around the world.

WORLD YOUTH DAY CROSS: In the summer of 2002, St. John Paul II gathered with the youth of the world in Toronto for World Youth Day. Approximately 300 participants from the Diocese of Buffalo signed a wooden cross that was used for the Stations of the Cross prayed with Bishop Mansell. In 2016, the youth of the world have been invited to join Pope Francis in Krakow, Poland for World Youth Day. Approximately 170 participants from the Diocese of Buffalo, ***including our parishioner, Hannah Cline***, will travel to Poland. Many of them have already signed the outer edges of the Diocese of Buffalo World Youth Day Cross. The cross will be at our parish next weekend, ***October 24th and 25th*** and will travel throughout the Diocese in preparation for World Youth Day in Krakow 2016. Please pray for those who will be making the World Youth Day pilgrimage in July 2016. Also, if you or someone you know attended the Toronto World Youth Day in 2002, look for their name and pray that the spirit of World Youth Day will renew their faith.

YOU DID IT FOR ME: Victoriana* was 5 years old when she saw her father gunned down in front of their home in Honduras. The image haunted her for years, but bilingual mental health counseling sessions provided by Catholic Charities helped her address her past fears. Her counseling team helped provide her with mental tips to healthily process flashbacks when they occurred, and worked with her and her mom to establish permanent legal residency in the United States.
