A NOTE FROM FATHER:

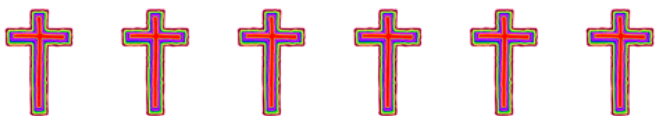
